

### **School Messages**

#### Vaccinations

We have organised a visit from the Richmond Road Medical Practice on Friday April 26th for pupils to receive any childhood immunisation vaccinations that they are either due or may have missed, for the health and wellbeing of the whole school community. Look out for a letter on our return after Easter.

There has been an increase in Measles cases recently and a decrease in the uptake of childhood vaccinations, and in particular the MMR. Vaccination will lower your child's risk of hospital admission and can help them recover more quickly if they catch COVID-19.

Vaccination gives better protection than any immunity gained from a previous infection. Even if your child has been vaccinated before, it's important they get the protection they need because viruses change, and protection fades over time.
