Hackney Safer Schools App

The City and Hackney have a free app that parents can download from the app store or play store
on their devices. This app has videos and tutorials on how to make your devices and apps safe for
children to access, information on online safety, as well as tips on how to mute and report unsafe
images or websites –We highly recommend that you download the app.

To do so: 1. Search safer schools in your Appstore or Play store - It looks like this>

2. Download this app

3. Once in the app search 'Hackney Safer Schools'

4. You will be asked for a code - you can use the Primary code (7440) or Secondary code (7675)

Feel free to contact the school if you need any help downloading this app



KIDS - Many of our pupils use YouTube to search for videos to watch, but we know that the
main YouTube website has a lot of content that is harmful and inappropriate for children to access. To
minimize the chances of children accessing inappropriate material we suggest that all our pupils have access
to YouTube Kids – this can be downloaded at your Appstore or Play store.



- Before watching a Film or TV series, search the title in your search engine (Google or Microsoft
edge) followed by the words 'parent guide'. This will take you directly to the parent guide section of
IMDb. This will not only give you the age rating of the show, but will detail if there are any scenes
of a sexual nature, violent or frightening scenes, drug or alcohol use or if there is profanity.



- Finally, parents can use the Internet Matters Website to access guides on how to set up parental
controls on every device, app, browser and gaming console – Just choose from the drop-down
