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Fact:

Symptoms of autism can vary between people

<u>Autism is a spectrum condition</u>. While all people with autism share certain difficulties, they will be affected in different ways. For a diagnosis to be made, difficulties must be persistent and limit everyday functioning.

Myth:

Autism only affects boys

Girls can also be diagnosed with autism, but it is <u>four times more common</u> in boys than girls.

Myth:

People with ASD don't care about others

People with ASD do care for and love others. However, they have problems expressing their feelings and affections.

Fact:

Some children may have signs of other conditions alongside autism

Some people with autism may also have learning difficulties, mental health issues, or other conditions. This means different people need different levels of support.

Myth:

Children with autism are often savants

<u>Just under half of those diagnosed with autism also</u> <u>have a learning disability</u>. Others have an IQ in the average to above average range. 'Savant' abilities are rare.

Fact:

People don't grow out of autism

<u>There is no cure for autism</u>, and it is a lifelong condition. However, a range of strategies can be used to support those with autism.

Myth:

The MMR vaccine causes ASD

In the past, some people believed the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine caused ASD. However, there is <u>no evidence of a link between the</u> <u>vaccine and ASD</u>.

Fact:

People with autism can learn social skills

<u>People with autism can learn social skills</u>, but need personalised, specialised teaching and training from professionals to do so. This is because they often don't develop some of the social skills we take for granted.

Fact:

Autism is a hidden disability

ASD is a developmental disorder, which means it is a difference in the way the brain works. <u>You can't</u> <u>always tell if someone has autism</u>.
